How To Choose A Stud Dog

Jon Steele: Auroral Borzoi (Jon & Jennni Steele)

hen asked to write a few words on stud dog selection, I am sure there are more people qualified

than us with way more litters. On the other hand, with fewer litters with all champion, multiple specialty winners, and multiple Top 10 Borzoi maybe we have something to offer.



When choosing a stud dog our choice has always been to breed a young bitch to an older, proven stud or when taking a chance on a young dog to use an older, proven bitch. That way we already know what at least half of the pedigree will produce and any surprises we know where that trait came from. Also, if the litter is not up to your expectations you can go back and breed away from those traits without eliminating both the dog and bitch from your breeding program.

The first of wo important traits in choosing a stud dog is how strong is the top line of the pedigree. The strength of a good stud dog comes through all the sires on the top of the pedigree. If you like the dog, his sire, the grand sire and the great grand sire the chances that you will have a positive impact is greater than expecting to breed based on the sire of that dog's dam, or a dog elsewhere in the pedigree. Second is never breed to a dog that is a one-of. In other words, how strong was the litter that dog came from? Do you like the brothers or was this dog the only male that had potential or accomplishments of note?

Breeding is a series of risks and anything you can do to reduce the risk of failure moves your breeding program along on a more successful track. Today most people do not have the luxury of test breedings for obvious reasons. Lastly, check your emotions at the door. Be realistic. If you loved a certain dog you need to be honest about the attributes and faults of that dog. We all have had heart dogs but not all heart dogs should be used.

Breeding is not an exact science and the more you are aware of just what a stud dog can do to improve your bitch, the farther your breeding program progresses. That is, unless you think you already bred the perfect Borzoi and if that is the case please let us know.

Patti Neale: Sylvan Borzoi (Chris & Patti Neale)

hoosing a stud dog is one of the most challenging tasks faced in breeding Borzoi. Like many

long-time breeders, we find the strength of the breed, and our kennel, is in the bitches, so a breeding quality male is both rare, and highly appreciated.



We are always looking for a

"stallion hound", a proud, curvy, elegant dog that draws the eye from a distance, both standing and moving. Long head, long neck, long stride, long tail. Nature tends to revert to the middle ground when undirected, so a bit of extreme can be tolerated. Sound temperament is a must.

Having found Mr. Wonderful, we consider any known health problems in his close-up pedigree and any phenotypical insufficiencies that may conflict with our dogs' family history. Generally, we are breeding from a sound, athletic bitch that has only minor flaws, so choosing a fancier male usually works well.

With a strong foundation of mostly line-bred bitches, we can, on occasion, leave the comfort zone of greater predictability. We have gone out to several completely unrelated males in the past and have mostly been successful in bringing desired qualities back into our core stock. Choosing an outside stud is not getting married... one is not obligated to continue breeding from an experiment that doesn't quite meet expectations. As long as the resulting get are healthy and sane, no litter should be thought of as a failure. Being a good pet is a dog's highest calling.

Kalen M. Dumke Voogt: Nonsuch Borzoi (Karen & Kalen Dumke)

ndividual breeding programs have varying degrees of success depending on many factors, the choice of the right stud dog being one of those factors. This equation is greatly influenced by the quality of the bitches (strengths, weaknesses and bloodlines). There are those breeders who only outcross, selecting from a large gene pool and subsequently trying to avoid faults or breeding for one purpose. Personally, my dogs and choice of stud dogs have always consisted of linebreeding, with select outcrosses to bring in new lines that were compatible with health,

conformation, movement, tempera-

Another issue to consider is whether the stud dog is a "producer" who can either stamp his get with his best

> qualities or when mated with a good bitch, may not throw himself but produces better than himself. I've owned lovely males

who excelled in the show ring but did not consistently produce great offspring. On the other hand, there were males who had faults but when bred with complimentary bitches produced offspring that were consistently superior than either parent. What I've found with linebreeding is consistent style or type, combined with the strength and predictability behind those bloodlines. Select outcrossing brings in new blood and other qualities that may be lacking in your original line. Of course, there is always a chance that the outcross just doesn't work. I wasn't afraid to go "back to the drawing board' if the lines didn't produce the quality I was looking for. When I did outcross, it was always to a line that was compatible in conformation and health.

One of the biggest problems I've seen are people who choose a stud dog because of what he's won in the show ring or because he's the "popular" choice. It's a "one size fits all" equation that is almost sure to disappoint. Just because the dog is lovely, it doesn't mean he's the right choice for your bitch. Wild outcrosses can sometimes produce a few lovely individuals, but not necessarily a litter of consistent quality. When we breed, it's not just for one generation, but for future generations as well. There are breeders that may have a litter with top-winning individual dogs but subsequent generations are mediocre at best. The entire reason behind a good breeding program is consistency in quality, health and temperament. These breeders may repeat the winning litter with varying results. A breeding program is just that...the quest for consistent quality over generations, not just one litter. Do the siblings look similar, or do they all look like they came from different parents? What are the breeder's priorities? Often, a linebred pedigree will come through with strength of producing bloodlines and consistency in conformation, heads, movement and health. Parent clubs and health testing have come a long way since I started breeding. There is no excuse for not doing your homework and following testing guidelines as an important "tool" in your breeding program. I've often wondered why an "experienced" breeder would seek outside opinions (in puppy evaluation) from individuals who were not familiar with their breed. Individual linebred puppies often mature at different rates and go through growth stages with which outsiders are not familiar. In these cases there is a great deal of room for error.

National specialties are a wonderful resource for Borzoi breeders to see not only potential stud dogs, but a "showcase" for breeders to bring their best stock, including several generations of their breeding program. Over the years, I've seen both breeders and spectators in awe of the winners, with not a glance at the dogs that didn't win that day. I always looked for the best dogs, regardless of what ribbons they carried out of the ring that weekend. Astute breeders would appreciate the qualities in good dogs, whether they won or lost on that day.

In closing, I look for individual stud dogs that are either of similar bloodlines, with compatible conformation to my bitches, or a stud dog with compatible bloodlines and conformation that compliments my bitches. Another factor is to look at the puppies that were previously sired by the male. Was the male one that produced lovely offspring? Consistency? Healthy puppies with good temperaments? I also am a firm believer in utilizing frozen semen to bring old, quality lines back into the gene pool. This can be a treasure trove for breeders and not to be ignored.

I'd like to thank my sister and co-breeder, Karen Dumke, for being the other half of the success of the Nonsuch breeding program.

Amy Sorbie: Kyrov Borzoi



hoosing a stud dog can be a daunting task for most breeders. The goal is to maintain or add needed strengths to your current breeding program. I have seen many a breeder produce nice dogs

> first few generations only to lose quality in the long run. I, luckily, have a strong male line, so can often use

my own stud dogs. Obviously, using stud dogs from one's own line is easy as you are using known pedigrees and known health and temperament, which is something that is not always easily

obtained when you outcross. Linebreeding also gives you nicely linebred bitches to hold and maintain quality and consistency. It is not smart, however, to use one's own line exclusively. If a breeder linebreeds too tightly, vigor and diversity, and size and fertility, suffer. Outcrossing can also bring in a characteristic that your line currently needs. Therefore, I believe it is necessary to linebreed and outcross to maintain health, temperament and quality in a successful breeding program.

For me, phenotype (physical attributes present) and genotype (genetic makeup and inherited genes) for this purpose, pedigree, though it is a bit more complicated than that, are equally important. Pedigree figures heavily in my breeding decisions. I have lines I prefer to work with and incorporate, and lines I prefer not to use in my breeding program. Even if I like a dog very much, if I do not like his pedigree, I will not use him. I also believe that producing ability is genetic. There are a lot of nice show dogs and bitches out there who do not produce quality or consistent puppies no matter how nice the partner. Conversely, there are Borzoi that produce well no matter the quality of the partner. Researching previous litters and the producing capabilities of the entire line is vitally important.

I insist upon both exquisite type and proper structure in my Kyrov Borzoi. I fully believe that the absence of faults is no guarantee of presence of virtues! I am brutally honest when critiquing my brood bitches. I know their strengths as well as their weaknesses. I do not keep or breed girls I do not consider top quality. As do most breeders, I make sure to look for a dog that is strong where improvement is needed in my girl. The things I do not compromise on are temperament, health, heads, shoulders and movement, in that order. Temperament is top priority. They first have to be a great companion before anything else. Borzoi are too big and strong to not have the sweetest of temperaments. Health is the second priority but that is a much longer conversation. In my opinion, the requirements and testing for CHIC numbers are just the tip of the iceberg. There are so many things for which there are no current tests. Breeders need to keep track of all problems in their lines. Refined beautiful heads, which are called for in our standard, are recessive. If you breed to a coarse, unattractive head, you will have heads that lack type dominant in your lines. Likewise, good, well-angled shoulders are recessive and therefore easy to keep in your lines; however, if you breed to a dog with a straight shoulder and upper arm, you will have a dominant gene for straight shoulders that will plague you for a lifetime. Proper sidegait is a must. For me it is what separates the "men from the boys" so to speak. The dog can be the most beautiful thing in the world standing but if he has restricted or even average sidegait, he is not for me or my breeding program

I definitely breed for full litters of quality. I have had up to eight champions in one litter. My friends make fun of me for this but I like to pick and keep puppies that are my favorite colors. I know that sounds crazy to most but I think that desire has kept my litters strong throughout. I like to keep puppies that are beautiful to gaze upon both close up, with a lovely head, eye and expression,

and from afar with a pleasing outline and a marvelous color. I love my intense red and whites, my elegant tri colors, my precious and elusive whites and my soft spotted sables. So, I say with tongue in cheek just a little bit, if I want my "keeper" puppy to be the best color, the whole litter has to be pretty darn strong!

Finding the perfect stud dog is virtually impossible. If you wait to find the perfect dog, you will likely wait forever. You just have to find the best you can and then go for it! Sometimes a leap of faith ends up delivering the prettiest puppies. I have always said that breeding is not for the faint of heart. Choosing the right stud dog is only the start of a long line of decisions to come.

Anne Midgarden: Téine Borzoi



tud dog shopping. It is what all breeders do, all the time. And I mean ALL the time. We used to have to go to dog shows and hunts to find an exciting male to breed to. One

> of the great things about social media is that we do get to see at least pictures and pedigrees of dogs near and far.

So here is my take on picking a stud dog. What does

your bitch have to offer the breed? Be critical, be serious. What about her is really outstanding? What is average? What needs to be "fixed"? Of her outstanding features what can you live without in a stud dog and hope her excellence in this area carries through? How deep in her pedigree are those outstanding qualities?

Ok, so now you know what faults your stud dog can have; and that is important, because no dog is perfect. Now you need a list of what he must have. Everyone says "good temperament". What is good exactly: Not reactive? Not aggressive? Friendly to everyone? Lots of prey drive? Quiet and chill? Try to pin down what you want so you know what questions to ask about his behavior.

If coursing, racing and hunting are your first love, you are MUCH more likely to get this from breeding to a dog who has been successful in field.

If conformation dog shows are your joy, then you have more flexibility. You want to look at dogs with solid overall nice structure but they do not necessarily need to have big show wins behind them. The advantage of the big winners is that we know about

those dogs, but sometimes there is a brother at home who is just as nice and "fixes" your bitch better. So ask.

Pedigrees are a very useful tool but only if you know the dogs in the pedigree. The tradition is that linebred dogs are more consistent. I have not found this to be true, but many have.

So make a list of who is out there and go see them yourself. This is important. I once made a road trip to see a dog who looked lovely in the pedigree and photos but when I actually saw him, he was stone blind. Sometimes, you just don't know what questions you needed to ask ahead of time.

Something else that needs to be considered is "Is the sire owner sane?" This, too, can be worked around but I highly recommend contracts whether the sire owner is your best friend or someone with a reputation for not signing the AKC papers. It is ALWAYS helpful to look back on what you agreed upon.

So do your breeding and whelp your litter, and I hope the puppies are all you hoped for and more.

Shirley McFadden: Svora Borzoi

have owned Borzoi since the early '90s and have been a Borzoi breeder under the kennel prefix "Svora" since 1997. I do not breed often so I try make the best decisions with as few litters as pos-

sible. First and foremost, it is important to know the AKC Borzoi standard and know how to evaluate each component of the standard and apply



it to Borzoi. It can take years to develop an "eye" for the many variations of correct, as well as to recognize the finer details of conformation that are the essence of Borzoi. With the internet, we have a great advantage over breeders of the past in that we can study Borzoi and pedigrees from around the world via photos, videos and pedigree databases. A good student of Borzoi will be able to recognize the variations of correct as well as the deviations from correct that are often passed on with breeding. You can see the various families or bloodlines having a common "look" or shared traits that are actually an expression of genes that are the phenotype. Phenotype is what you can see or observe outwardly

or is expressed in biochemical ways such as health. Genotype is the internal DNA that you may or may not see in the phenotype but may be seen across the breadth of the pedigree. Phenotype is influenced by both genotype and environment. Phenotype is a good indicator of the traits you are likely to see in your future puppies but it isn't a guarantee. When choosing a stud dog or a brood bitch, I want to know what is not only visible in the potential parents but what is in the entire families on both sides. This helps me have an idea of the genotype that is below the surface of my potential stud dog or brood bitch. I research the history of their parents, siblings, aunts, uncles, grandparents and cousins.

I have had good results from both outcrossing and linebreeding. Linebreeding is a good tool when used to strengthen outstanding virtues. Linebreeding, just for the sake of linebreeding, will not improve quality. It just locks in what is already there. In both cases, I prefer to breed phenotype to phenotype. This is after having done my homework on the prepotency of those desired or undesired traits of the entire family of dogs. To do this, I also pay close attention to what other breeders are getting with various breeding combinations. You can learn a lot from watching repeated patterns of expression (or not) in the various bloodlines and combinations through linebreeding and outcrossing. As there is no "perfect" dog, there is always something we would like to change or tweak in even our best dogs.

I look for stud dogs that not only will double up on my bitch's strengths but to also "do no harm" by bringing in something that would be difficult to breed away from. For example, a stud dog may really stamp with his image and conformation. Or, when bred to a tightly linebred bitch, may not have much influence at all on phenotype. There are occasions when both scenarios are the best route for the breeding you are considering. Recognize the strengths and weakness of your bitch and her pedigree. Then determine what your breeding objectives are for this girl. This will help you decide which stud dog is best. You may want to improve a few things that the bitch needs "corrected" while at the same time not diminishing the outstanding virtues of the bitch.

However you need to also be aware of what faults are pre-potent in your bitch. For example, years ago I noticed a (foreign) bitch that no matter what lovely dog she was bred to, most of the puppies had her long body and flat topline. I saw her offspring producing the same thing. She was pre-potent for that outline and topline. She really needed to be bred to a tighter-bred dog with the correct topline across his pedigree. And it may have taken several generations. Also, one outstanding dog or bitch in a litter of mediocrity may have just been dealt a lucky hand of phenotypical traits but is unable to pass on its best virtues. I like to see what the likelihood is that the Borzoi will pass on his virtues or the faulty/mediocre traits of his littermates. This is why studying the patterns and outcomes in other breedings across the breadth of the pedigree is a good tool in choosing a stud.

feel that the most important aspect of a potential stud dog is his pedigree. He can only produce what's behind him. I'm also a big believer in the

> more of the traits of the grandparents in the puppies, rather than the parents.

After many generations. I know

what the strengths are in my bitch line. I have only rarely used my own males. I have not been afraid of being the first person to use a male. I lean toward males that will compliment my bitches, without losing what I've strengthened in my female line. I have

used dogs sight unseen. Only once did I use a male that I saw in the flesh for the first time who wowed me.

I tend to use pedigrees that are not the most popular. Not that they're not good dogs but we are starting to get an obvious genetic bottleneck. I recently saw a post about an import from Europe that was about 75\% American pedigree, some of which we already have too much of (IMO).

My criterion for defining a good Borzoi is one that is first and foremost an athlete. The dogs that fit my definition of that have good muscle, correct toplines and sound running gear. They also generally have strong, solid shoulder assemblies, something that seems hard to get for some show-only breeders, based on all the comments I see about how hard it is to get good shoulders. I will willingly sacrifice a bit of reach for a shoulder assembly that will hold up under serious work. These dogs more than hold their own in the show ring as well as in the field.

After 40-plus years, I feel I can look at a pedigree (maybe not even the dog other than photos) and decide if "that will work" or not with one of my girls. So far, that's resulted in my most successful litters. I look for certain structural traits that suggest that a dog could run and an above average amount of natural muscling. I look for a pedigree that produces a relatively high number of quality dogs per litter; I'm not looking for an outstanding dog with a bunch of unknown littermates. Mostly, I want a dog who himself, and his pedigree, indicate he will produce individuals that meet my definition of athlete. §



What's New On The Research Forefront

- Morris Animal Foundation (MAF) has set aside this year for canine research a singular focus on Osteosarcoma. After two days of rigorous evaluation, eight proposals were recommended for funding, covering topics like cancer, pathology, genetics, genomics and epidemiology. The proposals are with the Research Oversight Committee for evaluation and approved studies will then pass to the Animal Welfare Advisory Board for final review. Stay tuned for updates on these newly funded studies.
- The Canine Health Foundation held its biennial 3-day National Parent Club Canine Health Conference the second weekend of August. There were 13 presentations of work-in-progress research and also the presentation of the Asa Mays, DVM Excellence In Canine Health Research Award to Dr. Gary Johnson, University of Missouri with an introduction by Eddie Dziuk, OFA. Below is the official news release:
- "RALEIGH, NC (August 9, 2023) The AKC Canine Health Foundation (CHF), a non-profit organization dedicated to advancing the health of all dogs and their owners, announces Dr. Gary Johnson as recipient of the 2023 Asa Mays, DVM Excellence in Canine Health Research Award.

"Named for Dr. Asa Mays, a member of CHF's first Board of

Directors in 1995, the award is a biennial honor presented to a research investigator who demonstrates meritorious achievements in furthering the mission of identifying, characterizing, and treating canine disease and ailments. The award will be presented by Dr. Laura Liscum, CHF Scientific Review Committee Chair, and Dr. Carolyn Henry from the University of Missouri College of Veterinary Medicine, during the 2023 AKC Canine Health Foundation National Parent Club Canine Health Conference on Saturday, August 12.



"Gary Johnson, DVM, PhD is an Assistant Professor in the Department of Veterinary Pathobiology at the University of Missouri College of Veterinary Medicine. Since the early 1990's, Dr. Johnson has been searching for genetic mutations responsible for a wide variety of heritable diseases in domestic animals. In 2013, Dr. Johnson and his colleagues were among the first to use whole genome sequencing to identify mutations responsible for heritable canine diseases.

They have used this technology to identify the genetic causes for numerous heritable canine diseases such as degenerative myelopathy, neuronal storage diseases, glaucoma, and more.

- "'Dr. Johnson's pioneering research in canine genetics brought a new era to canine health,' says CHF Chief Executive Officer Dr. Stephanie Montgomery. 'His groundbreaking career not only decoded genetics, it also deepened the connections we have with our canine companions.'
- "As Dr. Johnson nears retirement, a generous gift from the Orthopedic Foundation for Animals (OFA) will establish the Dr. E. A. (Al) Corley OFA Endowed Program in his honor to ensure a bright future for canine molecular-genetic research at the University of Missouri College of Veterinary Medicine. A new, yet-to-be-named, program director will lead the program into an era of artificial-intelligence-assisted research to identify the genetic mechanisms underlying complex canine diseases and behaviors.
- "'Dr. Johnson has become a household name in the world of canine health research,' says Eddie Dziuk, OFA Chief Operating Officer. 'He is undoubtedly one of the most prolific researchers making genetic discoveries leading to DNA tests for various canine diseases. At the end of the day, no one can question the fact that Dr. Johnson's work and dedication have absolutely made our dogs healthier.'

BORZOI IN THE MANGER

Several years ago I got an unusual Christmas present from a close Borzoi friend. It was three different size Borzoi from a nativity scene. (Photo A) All the dogs are posed and colored in about the same way and I noticed that they were all made in Italy. They are not really elegant Borzoi, but they are Borzoi. I put the dogs in our case of small figures and did not give it too much thought.

Two years ago we received a Christmas catalog and on one of the pages was a large Italian Nativity scene. I noticed that the single dog was the same as the ones we had received. For some reason I kept looking at the ad and was I suprised to see another piece that has a Borzoi. It is of a standing Shepherd who has a Borzoi on a lead. The individual pieces in the set were not for sale just the complete set. I was not about to buy a whole set just to get one piece. It did have the name of the company, House of Fontanini, that made the sets and I filed that information away for future reference.

Last Fall Paul and I went shopping at the large mall by the Mississippi River and I ran across the same Italian set, but again only whole sets were offered for sale. Then in late June of this year, 1989, I was killing time in the Quarter on Sunday morning waiting for one of the antique shops to open. I decided to get out of the heat and walk down the street to Santa's Quarters. This is a year round Christmas decoration shop and I enjoy going there to see all the lovely decorations. On this visit I noticed that there was a back room. When I walked in I was shocked. There was a section on the far wall with five or six shelves of nothing but House of Fontanini nativity pieces. They had all three sizes of the single dog, the shepherd with the Borzoi on lead and another piece of a young peasant boy with a Borzoi jumping up on him. All of these were individually priced and I was finally able to get the shepherd as well as the peasant boy.

I began then to look for information on the company. They have been existence for 80 years and are best known in



Europe and the US for their expansive line of nativity scenes. Their nativity scenes range in height from about 2 1/2" to 50". Their present market is built on the idea of a collectable nativity as new pieces are added each year. The finely crafted molds are currently designed by Elio Simoneti. The figures are polyurethane, but are nicely detailed. They maintain their color and are virtually unbreakable.

Photo A is of the 3 size single walking tan Borzoi. Each piece is stamped with the word Italy and the symbols I do not know when the figures were made. The large dog is about 3" tall; the medium is about 2 1/2" tall and the small is about 2 1/4" tall.

Photo B is of the Shepherd and Borzoi, on the left; the peasant boy and Borzoi on the right. The Shepherd is also stamped with the words Despose Italy but the mark is which, looks to me, like a spider. Under the word Despose is the number 120. This figure is about 5" tall and the Borzoi is the size of the small walking single Borzoi.

The peasant boy, on the right of Photo B, also has the words Despose Italy stamped on the bottom. The marks on this piece match the ones on the single dogs. Additionally the word Fontanini and the year 1983 appear. The number under the word Despose is 191. This piece is about 3 3/4" tall and the Borzoi is about 2 1/4". This is by far the best Borzoi as well and the best detailed figure.

These pieces are available in many of the year round Christmas Shops and reasonably priced. I have seen starter sets in Hallmark stores this Fall. The single dogs already have Japanese copy counterparts so I am sure that some of the other figures will soon follow.

So now when your are out doing your Christmas shopping you can check to see if you can find your own Borzoi in the manger.

TALES FROM THE ONE-EYED BORZOI

Part II A RUNNING DOG FOR ALL SEASONS By: Bob Schulze

Hello, little and big friends out there! Sometime in October, Miss Bobbie Longview put me in a head lock and would not let go until I promised to write something for the <u>Discourse</u>. Since writing is not one of my finer points (there are few) and this article represents a monumental task on my part, I decided to go for broke and write on a most controversial topic - - What makes a good hound or a breedable hound. Hope you like it!

When I talk about a good hound I am referring to the running and hunting standpoint. This hound must be capable of catching and killing and the game it is turned loose on, mainly jacks, fox and coyotes. He or she must be able to do this day in and day out, consistently, as we do not want "one run dogs". This article mainly refers to Deerhounds and Borzoi, although some of it applies to other sight hound breeds.

In my opinion, it takes four characteristics for a good running hound. They are running ability, desire, brains and temperment. Each one of these characteristics are of equal importance. The hound that has the best of all four is the hound that is going to bring home the ribbons or the hides.

Let's take a look at the four.

Running ability: Running ability can be divided into two areas, static balance and dynamic balance. Static balance would be the study of the hound at rest. Dynamic balance would be the study of the hound in motion. A word about each. Since static balance is studying the hound only at rest, it is not as important as dynamic balance. Dynamic balance includes static balance plus muscle strength and flexability, coordination and the condition of the hound. You can have poor static balance and good dynamic balance and have a good runner. However, if you have good static balance and poor dynamic balance the dog would not be able to cut it in the field (Take heed show people). The most desirable would be good static balance and good dynamic balance. Some things I look for in a hound are: High tail set with moderate or very little croup drop off. The loin, hip and thigh muscles are longer with a high tail set. These muscles drive the pelvic limbs. With longer muscles we get more drive out of the rear. Skin out a fox or coyote if you don't believe. Croup drop off should be moderate. In some dogs you see a lot of croup drop off. This hound has to take more steps to keep up with a hound that has a longer coupled rear which comes with a moderate or very little croup drop off.

Chest Size versus Body Weight: To get any distance out of a hound you must have the chest size for the lungs and heart to work. Too many dogs are being bred that have an inadequate chest size. They might cut it lure chasing but when we go where the "big boys" play these dogs would not have any distance in the open field.

Feet: Ask any "good old houndsman" from Nebraska what the most important trait is in a hound and he will say, "feet". When new hounds are looked at, old hound men always glance down and inspect the feet. You can have the best desire, running ability, etc. but if the feet are not there the hound is going nowhere. In your NOFCA hunts a lot of hounds are pulled the next day because of foot problems.

Balance, front and rear: If the hound has a well angulated rear the front must have some angulation in the shoulder blades. If the rear is not as well angulated then the front should be straighter. If this balance is not present then the rear end will over run the front or the front will pull the rear along depending on where the angulation is or isn't. A hound with a straight front and a well angulated rear, or visaversa, cannot outrun a hound with a balanced front and rear, whether it is straight or well angulated.

Good Jaw Power: Borzoi and Deerhounds have tremendous jaw power. This gives you quick kills with minimum hide damage. You will not believe the jaw power until you pelt out the fox or coyote and see what goes on underneath. This is one reason coyote hunters cross Greyhounds with Borzoi or Deerhounds - jaw power. Hounds with weaker jaws tend to tear hides as they grab at the critter. If you own these weaker jawed hounds, you must become good with a needle and thread to sew up the tears. Since I continuously run the needle in my fingers, I tend to like the "power breeds".

Size versus Conformation: Larger dogs must have better conformation. The skeleton must support more wight so it has to follow the breed standard more closely. Smaller hounds can get away with more faults and still perform excellent in open the field.

Muscle Flexibility: Hounds with more muscle flexibility have more reach and drive and can cover more ground. At this point in time I do not know if this developed or inherited.

Desire or Heart: In the description of a hound you often hear the phrase "the dog will not quit". Horse racers might say "that one has heart". Heart or desire is the hound's attitude on running or hunting. How bad does it want to catch the game? Will it run hurt? It can be tested at lure chasing events to some extent, however, the best way is out in the open field on jacks, fox and coyotes. Desire is evaluated on a NOFCA judge's score sheet.

Brains: Some people might call it intelligence. You might say trainability. Some dogs are smarter and train easier. Smart dogs learn faster and learn to catch more game because of this. The hound must be smart enough to chase what he is suppose to. Remember, you want the hound to hunt for you not for himself. The neighbor's chickens, other dogs or deer are desirable game and quickly get you in trouble.

Temperment: Temperment is very important in a hunting hound. The hound must be trustworthy around other dogs, children and people. The last thing you want when you are out hunting is a dog fight, whether in the dog box or out on the ground. However, when going on game that fights back, namely coyotes, the hound must show courage to take the quarry. This change or "snap" is found in Borzoi and to some extent Deerhounds. These hounds must show this courage to take on coyotes and yet be trustworthy around other animals and people.

And Further More: At this point I have stuck my neck out so far I just as well get it chopped off - - so....What breed is the best or how do I stack them up against each other?

Caution — Habit Forming continued

Saluki: Give me a pack of Salukis and I will catch more jacks than with any other breed. They are known for endurance and can catch jacks at the one to three mile mark. I think they are the hardest breed to judge (NOFCA) as they can go out of sight so easily. Some Saluki show excellent early speed. I believe they can be used on fox but coyotes would be tough.

Greyhounds: If I had one run and had money on it, give me a Greyhound. They are the fastest breed and maybe the most fun to watch on jacks. Some show good distance. If you own Greyhounds your best friend had better be a vet. They tend to break and the real fast ones (NGA) are always running on the edge of destruction. Track breeders say the brains have been bred out of them and after watching some I tend to agree.

Borzoi: Have tremendous speed, acceleration and some distance. They can be used on jacks, fox and coyotes. A good Borzoi is capable of winning a NOFCA mixed hunt. Be careful when selecting a Borzoi puppy. The show people have been breeding pretty, non-functional hounds for too long. The lure chasing people have been breeding smaller chested hounds with severe croup drop off. This gives you quick acceleration and instant cornering. However, this type hound would be left in the dust by a "running type" Borzoi.

Whippet: Excellent speed and distance. Some of my memorable courses have been Whippets or Greyhounds. On a jack, they may be at a disadvantage because of size when hunting in heavy cover.

Deerhound: Not as fast as the above four but a good Deerhound should have tremendous distance. Sadly, there are very few good running Deerhounds around anymore. Deerhounds will take a coyote or fox if they can stay on it long enough.

Afghan Hounds: If I said they could not catch a jack, Bonnie Schultz would sic her dogs on me. There are a few good running Afghan Hounds, but not many (See Bonnie, I love Afghans).

Irish Wolfhound, Ibizan Hound and Pharoah Hound: I have had little or no experience with these breeds except that Ibizan Hounds bark way too much for me.

Basenji: Unquestionably Mike Tait's favorite breed. Rumor has it (from a reliable source) he has money on ten pups. Any questions regarding Basenjis call Mike collect.

And One More Thing: A good "running type" Borzoi or Deerhound should be capable of winning in the show ring under some judges. This "running type" hound should also win in lure chasing events if it still has the desire to chase plastic (mine don't). However, the reverse is not always true. Show Champions and Field Champions may or may not make good runners. The only way to find out is to hunt them. I mean, after all, whether you breeders want to admit it or not, that is what they were first bred for.

Epilog: The ideas in this came from myself. I developed these ideas from reading books and articles, my physics background (statics and dynamics), talking with old houndsmen, and my observations when hunting. I have hunted in several states for jacks, fox and coyotes and have taken my fair share. However, things in this article are my own ideas and may or may not be agreeable with yours. I make no pretense that I know it all, especially about hounds, as I am always learning. Therefore, read it, digest it, and come up with your own conclusions. And at this point, I think it's time to say "Thanks for taking your time to read some ideas of mine".

aging 158 active research grants exploring heart disease, epilepsy, various cancers, and more. Learn more about this important work at *akcchf.org/research*."

Topics covered at the Parent Club Conference included presentations on Immunology and Microbiome, Tick-Borne Pathogens, Genetic Tests for Sighthounds: Anesthetic Drug Sensitivity and Delayed Postoperative Hemorrhage (DEPOH), Risk Factors for Congenital Megaesophagus, Pain Sensitivity in Different Dog Breeds, Harnessing the Power of Microbes to Fight Obesity: A First Look at the Canine SLIM Study, Gene Therapy for Treatment of Doberman Dilated Cardiomyopathy and lastly,

Treatment of Dogs with Gallbladder Mucocele Formation. More information will be forthcoming on all these studies once the research is completed and published. I look forward to seeing and sharing these results with all of you in the not-too-distant future. In closing, remember that our world is a better place for everyone because of our dogs. I. General (Borzoi registrations, point scales)

In 1967 there were 617 Borzoi registrations ranking Borzoi 61 out of 115 breeds. The AKC registered a total of 885,800 dogs. There were 255,862 poodles registered for first place, German Shepherd Dogs were in second place with 107,936 registered, followed by Beagles, Dachshunds, Chihuahuas, Pekingese, Miniature Schnauzers, Collies, Cocker Spaniels and Basset Hounds. The largest Borzoi entry was 100, with 85 shown at the Midwest Borzoi Club's Specialty in Detroit.

In 1967, the country was divided into 5 divisions for points. For Borzoi in Division 1, it took 2 dogs/2 bitches for 1 point, 3 dogs/3 bitches for 2 points, 4 dogs/4 bitches for 3 points, 6 dogs/6 bitches for 4 points and 10 dogs/10 bitches for 5 points. (This division contained the states of WI, IL, IN, OH, MI, PA, NY, NJ. MD. VA. DE. CT. RI. MA. ME. NH. VT). The scale of points in Division 2 for Borzoi was 2/2 3/3 4/4 5/5 6/7 for West and South (WV KY TN NC SC GA FL AL MS LA AK OK TX NM AZ MN. For Borzoi in the California division shows, it took 2 dogs/2 bitches for 1 point, 5 dogs/4 bitches for 2 points, 9 dogs/8 bitches for 3 points, 13 dogs/8 bitches for 4 points and 20 dogs/12 bitches for 5 points. The scale of points for Division 4 was the minimum 2/2 3/3 4/4/ 5/5 6/6 (ND SD MT WY UT NV ID OR WA).

II. New Titles For Borzoi in 1967 (D)=dog (B)=bitch

49 Champions were finished during 1967. The AKC published registered name, registration number, the sire and dam with their registration numbers, and the

stud book dates. There are no stud book dates for the sire and dam of imported dogs. For Obedience titles the AKC only published the registered name and registration number. The editor has added sex (D) or (B), date of birth, breeder, owner, and the BCOA Registry of Merit title (if any). The date for titles is the date the title was published in the AKC Gazette. Since It took 2-3 months for show results to be published, the titles listed here have title dates of 3-67 to 2-68.






